


David Hazelwood's latest book, <u>My Short Life as a Stepdad</u>, will be released on October 11, the day of the Annual Author's Luncheon!

## SUMMER READING PROGRAM 2022

The Shelbyville - Bedford County Public Library was proud to present our 2022 Summer Reading Program this year! The Library again partnered with The Fly and held larger programs in their building, and we were able to host children from the Boys and Girls Club, the SACP, and the Summer Program at East Side Elementary. There was a small bump in the road as the library had to close the last week of the program, and the Library appreciates everyone's understanding as we had to cancel some events of that week, reschedule the finale to be a finale/back to school event, and extend deadlines for summer reading game boards.



SBCPL registered almost 350 Summer Reading participants and had 2301 children, teens, and adults in attendance to in-person events over the weeks of Summer Reading. The 73 programs included performers, authors, crafts, STEAM activities, and Bookmobile. # TEENS 'N' SENIORS

The Shelbyville—Bedford County Public Library has received the SeniorTrust Digital Literacy Grant with which we want to start the <u>Teens 'N' Seniors Program</u>. This Grant is designed to help people over the age of 60 with new technology and learning how to use devices to communicate and stay connected.

With this grant SBCPL would like to have some of our local Teens help us by offering to schedule one-on-one sessions with patrons who need a little help learning the "new" stuff; like how to work that new phone they got for their birthday, or the Chromebook their grandkids gave them so they could stay in touch, or learning how to do that teleconference call with their doctor. These are the kinds of things that they need help with to keep them involved and connected to our community and to their families.

The SeniorTrust Digital Literacy Grant will help us fund this program. We will have 3 Chromebook & Hot Spot sets that will only be available to patrons 60 & up. These can be used for training or checked out to use at home for a period of 1 week, free of charge.

#### **ABOUT US**

The Shelbyville-Bedford County Public Library serves residents in Bedford County, Tennessee. Established in 1948 by the Veteran of Foreign Wars Ladies Auxiliary, what was known as the Bedford County Memorial Library was once housed in the unused passenger waiting room of the SC&StL Railway depot. Although The American Legion Auxiliary worked to initiate a library in the 1930s, records indicate it was burned in the courthouse fire of 1934. In 1964, when the General Services Administration provided use of the former post office as a public library, the remodeled building was named in honor of dedicated supporter of The American Legion Auxiliary's original efforts to form a library, Argie Cooper. In 2014, what is now the Shelbyville-Bedford County Public Library broke ground for it's own home where it currently stands.

Today, the Shelbyville-Bedford County Public Library has become a valuable resource for residents offering a vast digital collection including audio books, e-books, DVDs, magazines, movies, and TV shows in a variety of formats. The library circulates thousands of items a year and has librarians skilled in local resources and all aspects of reading for pleasure and research. Free to the public are multiple computers and Wi-Fi available. The Children's and Teen departments feature weekly activities for all ages. The library offers local history archives, an extensive historical newspaper collection, and information helpful in researching genealogy.
